AFCC's educational programs provide cross-professional communication and training, and encourage the development of interdisciplinary collaboration for the benefit of families and children in the justice system. There are approximately 4,000 members in 27 countries worldwide and 563 active members in California, 466 of whom are chapter members.

CONTINUING EDUCATION

The Conference provides up to 12.5 hrs. of continuing education and the Institutes provide an additional 4 hrs. of continuing education for the professional categories listed below.

Attorneys: The program has been approved by the California State Bar for general and family law specialization continuing legal education credit (MCLE & LSCLE (pending approval)). Program applies to specialization certification (LSCLE) in the following required topics: dissolution of marriage, mediation, custody of children, psychological & counseling aspects of dissolution, and domestic violence.

Minor's Counsel: The program meets the requirements for continuing education for minor's counsel under California Rules of Court, Rule 5.242(c).

Psychologists: The conference is eligible for up to 16.5 hours of continuing education for psychologists (Conference—12.5 hrs.; Pre-Conf. Institute—4 hrs.). LCSW & MFT: AFCC-CA is approved by the California Psychological Association (CPA) to provide continuing professional education for psychologists. The California Board of Behavioral Sciences (BBS) now recognizes CPA continuing education credit for license renewal for LCSWs and MFTs. AFCC-CA maintains responsibility for this program and its contents.

California Child Custody Evaluators & Mediators: The course outline/agenda for this training has been approved as corresponding to subject areas specified in California Rules of Court, Rules 5.210(f), 5.225(d)&(i), 5.215(j), 5.230(d), and 5.518(e)(3).
